Dear Church Family,

It's February 28th, and it's 70 degrees outside. It was actually hot sitting outside in the sun for lunch. I'm trying to enjoy the spring-like day, but in my head I know this is not normal. It is concerning—what is it going to be like this summer? Will we be able to withstand the heat? While we are supposed to be getting cooler temperatures and more precipitation next week, will we get enough to keep drought conditions and fire risk at bay? Under my breath, I pray, "God, help us!"

As a person who is supposed to encourage others, it is hard to admit that sometimes I run low on positive, hopeful thoughts. I know God is with us, no matter what. But I wish it felt like more humans (esp. in the U.S.) cared about what is going on in the world, from climate change to wars to hunger and refugees.

Jesus lived in a time when the "known world" was much smaller than it is today, but I'm sure he felt overwhelmed at times too. So what did he do? We know that he would go off by himself and pray for awhile. How many of us "go off and pray" on a regular basis? I think we tend to pray mostly in our homes or cars and in church.

When I used to take my dogs on longer walks, I would pray a bit along the way. I miss that. When I took my first mile and a half hike after my surgical recovery, I was so focused on my steps and not falling that I don't think I prayed anything except, "Lord, please don't let me fall!" I am going to make it a goal throughout Lent to get back to my prayer walks (either with or without my dogs). If anyone would like to walk with me, please let me know! I'll be keeping it "slow and even" for a few more weeks, so don't worry about me leaving you in the dust ...

Dust! That's a good reminder of Ash Wednesday coming up next week. In Genesis 2 it tells the story of God forming humans from the dust of the ground and blowing the breath of life into their nostrils. We were created from the earth—we are part of the earth, rather than separate from it. I think we could all use reminding of this on a regular basis. As creatures, we need to connect with the ground and to the God who created us. We need to feel the breath of the Holy Spirit flowing into us—whether that be from fresh air in the forest, or from the sound of beautiful music, or the feel of the ocean at our feet. The time had come to get rid of "stuff" in my parents' house. Luckily, they always lived modestly and didn't have a great amount to get rid of, but there was enough. We had a yard sale and us adult children took what we wanted to keep.

There was a beautiful old cedar chest in my parents' bedroom that kept important "stuff" like baby books, birth records, baptism records, military records, report cards, newspaper clippings, etc. I had briefly looked in it over the years, but never really saw all that was in it.

My sisters and I decided to finally go through it all and divide the stuff up and make a pile for my brother as he couldn't be there.

Dad was an only child, so he had lots of his parent's stuff saved in the chest too. There were quite a few black bibles in the chest saved from my grandmother.

My mother was an immigrant from Mexico and had kept her tiny New Testament bible that was written in Spanish on her dresser for as long as I can remember. My sister wanted that one.

Among the black bibles was one that I was intrigued with. It said *Bibeln* and was written in Swedish. We thought it was our great-grandfather's bible, since he was an immigrant from Sweden. In opening the bible, we discovered that it was a confirmation bible given to my grandmother Vera Olson on May 20th, 1917 in Malmo, Nebraska by the pastor W. Magnuson. What was more intriguing was a clipping of my great-grandfather's obituary.

My great grandfather, Hjalmar Olson was born in Stafanas, Yttra Rud, Vattmland, Sweden on February 1, 1873. He was baptized and confirmed in his home parish in Sweden. In 1891, he immigrated to America and settled in Walsenburg, Colorado where he worked for his brother. After a few more moves, he married my great- grandmother, Anna Lind, and settled first in Malmo and later Wahoo, both small towns in Nebraska. The clipping said he attended and was a trustee for several years in the Edensburg Lutheran Church. Later he attended the Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Wahoo, where my great-grandparents were faithful worshipers and gained many friends according to his obituary.

Many times I have wondered why I chose to be a Lutheran and that little newspaper clipping in a Swedish Bibeln made me feel like I was meant to walk in my great- grandparents' footsteps. I got to keep the treasured Bibeln.
