PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Church Family,

"A Message from God" By Lyn Walters

One morning I received an email saying I would be bitten by a snake on August 7th and there was no way to avoid it. The Bible is filled with portents and precognitions.

A rainbow is a sign of God's love for mankind and the earth and His promise not to destroy them again by catastrophic flood.

I also think of Jacob, that great dream interpreter, who predicts while in prison that the king of Egypt will restore his chief butler to his former place of honor but will order his chief baker to be hanged and left for the birds to eat, both in a matter of three days.

The whole Hebrew people lived for a time under the influence of the great prophets who foretell God's will to His people.

A heavenly dove is a sign of God's love for His Son with whom He is well pleased on the shores of the Jordan.

Jesus himself forecasts his crucifixion and resurrection by telling his disciples that he is the temple which will be destroyed and rebuilt in three days.

Predictions and symbols are things which the Bible treats seriously. So what do you make of a premonition that falls into your lap like my snake bite email?

First, I asked myself what it meant exactly. Would I be bitten by a literal snake? Or was it a symbolic thing? Like I'd be hit while driving by a Dodge Viper? Or even worse was it a metaphorical snake bite such as becoming seized by an evil thought or desire?

"Fear not," are often among the first words spoken by angels to whom they are appearing. I think of Mary in the first chapter of Luke. Angels, literally messengers from God, are not agents of fear although they might appear frightful.

God does not deal in hexes. Therefore a prediction of a snake bite is suspect on its face. Granted, humans have instincts that sense and guard them from danger. In this way we can look at fear as a kind of gift from God which helps us avoid and ward off evil.

But no. God's messages whether signs, premonitions, dreams, or angels, deal in the language of love. God's messages are optimistic and life affirming. They may seem scary at first because they are often meant to challenge you to spread your creaky wings and soar to higher places. God's messages may offer more freedom than you are comfortable with, a life with fewer boundaries. God's messages are always about living a life that is more lively.

So you can rest assured that getting bitten by a snake on August 7th or anything else like that isn't even in God's territory even if God is in the details.
