Dear Church Family,

It is a bittersweet thing to come to the end of the Christmas season. While some people like to take down their decorations before the end of December, many of us like to leave our trees and lights up until sometime in mid-January or even longer. Epiphany (when the wisemen arrived to visit Jesus after following the star) occurs on January 6<sup>th</sup> and between now and Lent, we will continue to focus on Jesus being the light of the world.

As followers of Jesus, we long for spiritual and ethical light for our world today. How can we best cope with the uncertainty and darkness around us? One way is to look to leaders who have sought light, hope, and righteousness in our more recent past. In this newsletter, I was inspired to include many quotes from Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.. One is on the church sign, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness, only light can do that." The quote continues, "Hate cannot drive out hate, only love can do that."

Light and love are themes for us as Christians, and Dr. King drew on his Christian faith for his inspirational speeches as well as in how he tried to live his life. All too often, those who try to bring light and love to the world are killed by the powers of darkness. Our savior, Jesus, was killed by the same darkness, yet his light lives on through those of us who follow him.

We see images of light and love in John 1:1. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." To be clear, the "Word" is Jesus, and John claims that Jesus was with God at the beginning of creation. In verses 4-5 it says, "What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overtake it."

To be a follower of Jesus means holding onto hope that the light will shine stronger than the darkness. Furthermore, each one of us is called to be a beacon of light in our broken world. As we begin this new year, let's try to focus on what we can do to bring light and love to the world around us. The light and life of Christ will not be overtaken!




